SKDC Direction

SKDC 2022 is located in the Evergreen Space Museum Building (far right)

From Portland

When traveling South on I-5, take exit #294 for Tigard / McMinnville and follow the signs to McMinnville. Continue on Highway 99W through Dundee until the Highway 18 “Ocean Beaches” junction. Turn left on Highway 18 and continue for approximately four miles. The Museum is on the right.

From Salem

When traveling North on I-5, take exit #253 at Salem for Highway 22 / Mission Street and follow the signs for Highway 22 / Mission Street through Salem. Stay to the left on Highway 22 after crossing the Willamette River. Turn right (north) at the intersection with Highway 99W. Continue northbound on Highway 99W to the outskirts of McMinnville. Take the Highway 18E exit and continue for approximately four miles. The Museum is on the left.

From the coast

When traveling on Highway 101, take Highway 18 and continue until the “Y” just before entering the City of McMinnville. Stay to the right at the “Y” heading toward Portland and Dayton. Continue on Highway 18 for approximately five miles. The Museum is on the left.

From Portland International Airport (PDX)

Travel east on Airport Way; follow signs for and merge onto I-205 S. After 3 miles, take exit 21B for I-84 W and continue for 5 miles. Use the left two lanes to take the exit towards Salem, then merge onto Interstate 5 South and follow directions above to continue on to McMinnville.

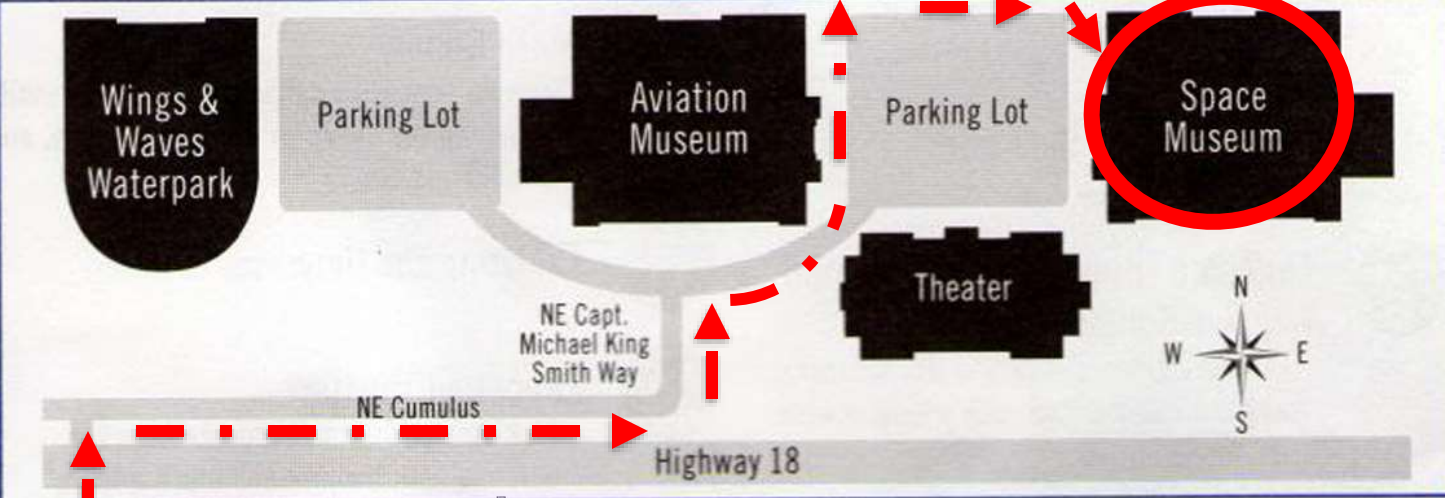

EVERGREEN CAMPUS MAP



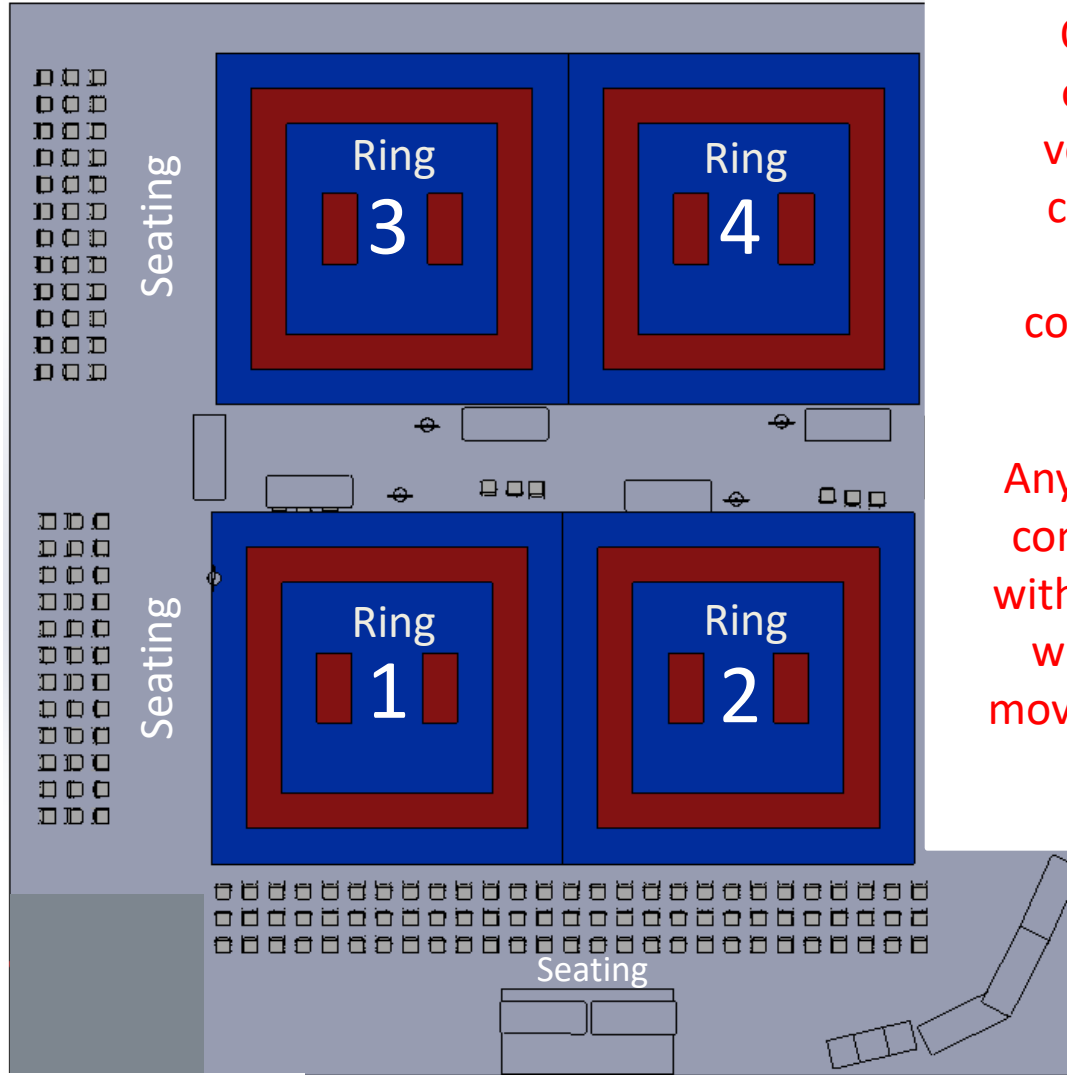

SKDC rules AS of 1/12/2023

- **General**
- Rules for the Saito Karate Do Classic are based on WKF/USA Karate
- Rules have/will be **modified** to accommodate less than 5 officials per ring (3 for Kata 3 for Kumite)
- Double thirds will be awarded for all divisions that utilize the flag scoring system.
- **For Coaches**
- **We love coaches!!!**
- Coaches are fantastic support for athletes and parents alike. Please read below so all coaches are clear of the expectations for the day's events.
- Coaches must have 1 of 2 credentials to coach at the SKDC. SKDC Coach's day pass. (given at the 8:00AM coaches meeting the day of the event) or a USA Karate current coaches credential. **Coaches must be dressed in proper attire (track suit and shoes) and adhere to a coaches' code of conduct. All coaches must be registered and agree to the coaches code of conduct.**

- **Kobudo & Team divisions:**
- We will be using a score system for kobudo and flags for teams.

Competitors must wear a white gi for kata and kumite competition.

Kata divisions:

- Kata divisions will use a 3 or 5 panel system depending on the availability of officials.
- Beginner and Novice competitors may only use the following katas or their style equivalent.
- Taikyoku – Heian/Pinan—Gekesai—Fukyu Kata—Kihon Kata—Chino Kata (Isshin Ryu Sesan)
- All Non Advanced AJKL divisions will perform kata side by side (two contestants at the same time).
- Advanced AJKL 12-17 karate divisions will be run with pools and scoring.
- All beg/nov and combined beg/nov divisions **may repeat the same kata in every round.**
- **Intermediate:** May repeat the same kata in every round.
- **Advanced competitors:** Non AJKL May repeat the same kata in every round **except for the medal round.**
- **AJKL Advanced competitors (12-17) only:** Must do a different kata each round. If more than 4 rounds they may repeat a kata that has already been performed.

Kumite divisions:

- For advanced divisions 12-34 we will endeavor to have 5 officials per ring unless circumstances dictate that we cannot. With a full panel the use of current WKF/USA Karate rules will apply.
- When using less than 5 officials per ring the following applies:
- 3 officials for kumite, 2 judges and one referee.
- The referee will also have a vote in scoring but must indicate the scoring side after yamei and prior to returning to the line to give a score.
- 2 flags and or one flag and referees opinion are needed to award points. Judges will be allowed indicate jogai. Referee will indicate all penalties and can implement with the conformation of one additional judge.
- This is just meant as a brief overview of the rules for officials and coaches. For full list of rules please current WKF / USA NKF rules.

SKDC Coaches Code of Conduct

I will:

1. Conduct myself in a dignified manner relating to emotions, language, attitude and actions
2. Act at all times to protect the principles of fun, safety and development of all athletes
3. Demonstrate respect for the ability of opponents as well as for the judgment of referees, officials and opposing coaches.
4. Display control and professionalism at all times under any circumstance.
5. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person, including opponents, other coaches, officials, administrators, parents, athletes, and spectators.
6. Refrain from physical contact with athletes except where necessary for the development of the athletes' skill(s) or athletic ability.
7. Be aware and understand the role and influence of a coach as an educator, imparting knowledge of skill as well as proper personal, academic, and social behavior.
8. Be reasonable in my demands on athletes' time, energy and enthusiasm
9. Provide an opportunity for all athletes to play the sport.
10. Agree to uphold the Progressive Coaching principles found within the USA Karate program.
11. Seek to learn the latest coaching practices that take into account the principles of growth and development of athletes.
12. Agree to abide by all applicable USA Karate rules and regulations, including USA Karate SafeSport policy
